

This work provides students vital exposure real-world the


practice of clinical psychology balanced with the latest research in the field.




Bowers, Edmond P. (2015) Promoting positive youth development. New York: Springer.

This book presents the results of the longitudinal 4-H Study of Positive

Youth Development. The volume discusses how self-regulation and contextual resources (e.g., strong relationships with parents, peers, and the community) can be fostered in young people to contribute to the enhancement of functioning throughout life.

Each chapter examines a particular aspect of youth thriving, and offers findings on either the bases or the role of positive development in a variety of outcomes, from reduced risk of emotional problems and harmful behaviors to increased participation in the community.



Wagner, William E. (2017). Using IBM SPSS statistics for research methods and social science statistics. London: Sage publications.

Reliable and student-friendly, this

by William E. Wagner, is known for its effectiveness in helping readers learn to use SPSS software for simple data management. Now reflecting SPSS Version 23.0, the Sixth Edition includes updated examples, screenshots, and tables based on current GSS (General Social Survey) data.

This manual is an excellent companion to any undergraduate social statistics and research methods text and is ideal as a stand-alone guide for those learning to use SPSS software for the first time.



Hickok, Gregory. (2016). Neurobiology of language. London: Academic Press.

This text explores the study of language. Key to this field is the accelerating trend toward integration of


neurobiological approaches with the more established understanding language within cognitive psychology, computer science, and linguistics. This volume serves as the reference on the neurobiology of language, bringing these various advances together into a single volume of 100 concise entries. The organization includes sections on the field's major subfields, with each section covering both empirical data and theoretical perspectives. "Foundational" neurobiological coverage is also provided, including neuroanatomy, neurophysiology, genetics, linguistic, and psycholinguistic data, and models.

#### Joldersma, Clarence W. (2016). Neuroscience and education. A philosophical appraisal. New York: Routledge.

This volume makes a philosophical contribution to the application of neuroscience in education. It frames neuroscience research in ways around educational conceptualizing and practices, while also taking a critical look at conceptual problems in neuroeducation and at the economic reasons driving the mind-brain education movement. It offers alternative approaches for situating neuroscience in educational research and practice, including non-reductionist models drawing from Dewey and phenomenological philosophers such as Martin Heidegger and Merleau-Ponty. The essays form an emerging dialogue to be used within philosophy of education as well as neuroeducation, educational psychology, teacher education and curriculum studies.







Schaffner, Kenneth F. (2016). Behaving. What's genetic, what's not, and why should we care? New York: Oxford University Press.


Behaving presents an overview of the recent history and methodology of behavioral genetics and psychiatric genetics, informed by a philosophical perspective. Contains a theory of models in biology and medicine, including psychiatry, which sees both basic mechanisms in biology and also mental disorders as a family of over-lapping prototypical multilevel causal models. The first in-depth philosophical analysis of the implications of the development of genome-wide association studies (GWAS) on both common traits of interest and patterns of traits constituting psychiatric disorders. Includes quotations from more than a dozen prominent behavioral and psychiatric geneticists whom the author has interviewed in recent years



#### Aubrey, Karl. (2016). Understanding & using Educational theories. London: Sage publications.

This textbook gives you a clear overview of the most influential twentieth and twenty-first century thinkers on education, including established names (including Vygotsky, Bruner, Dewey), more recent writers (such as Freire, Kolb, Claxton) and many other important theorists whose writings have helped shaped our views on teaching and learning.



Clinicians are guided step by step to teach teens and parents five sets of skills: Mindfulness, Distress Tolerance, Walking the Middle Path (a family-based module developed by the authors specifically for teens), Emotion Regulation, and Interpersonal Effectiveness.

Designed for optimal clinical utility, the book features session outlines, teaching notes, discussion points, examples, homework assignments, and 85 reproducible handouts, in a large-size format for easy photocopying.

Women and leadership: Selection, development, leadership style, and performance.

Gipson, Asha N; Pfaff, Danielle L.; Mendelsohn, David B. Teachers College, Columbia University, New York, NY, US.

Abstract: Despite the proliferation of leadership research in the past 75 years, investigating the ways in which women and men leaders enact and experience leadership continues to surface unanswered questions. Through the framework of selection, development, leadership style, and performance, we report gender-related findings from a broad survey of existing literature from the past three decades. Findings include differential rates of selection for women and men leaders; leader development considerations that vary by gender; evidence in favor of general similarities in leadership style (with noted exceptions) between women and men leaders; and similar performance outcomes between women and men leaders. The importance of context, be it job type, group composition, organizational culture, or industry/sector, was also revealed. 

#### Ehrenreich-May, Jill. (2014). Transdiagnostic treatments for children and adolescents. New York: The Guilford Press.

This volume presents cutting-edge advances in case conceptualization and intervention for children and adolescents, who typically present for mental health treatment with multiple, overlapping problems. Leading clinician-researchers examine common processes-including stress and coping, attention and interpretation biases, avoidant behaviors, and peer and family interactions-that underlie the development and maintenance of diverse forms of psychopathology. They describe exemplary treatments that target these processes and can be used across diagnostic categories.


Chapters on specific treatment protocols address the theoretical foundations, clinical strategies used, which patient populations each treatment is suitable for, and the status of the empirical evidence base.


